HISTORY SUBJECTS

JUNIOR HISTORY

The study of History in junior years examines events, people and societies from ancient, medieval and modern times in an effort to develop a deeper understanding of civics and citizenship. Historic themes of the conservation of colonialism and the making of the modern world are further investigated in junior years.

ELECTIVE HISTORY

Students explore the nature of history, heritage and archaeology and the methods that historians use to construct history through a range of thematic, historical studies. The students of elective history undertake a process of historical inquiry by analysing sources and sequencing historical events to construct logical arguments supported by evidence to communicate to different audiences.

ANCIENT HISTORY

The study of Ancient History provides students with the opportunity to develop and apply their understanding of issues involved in the investigation of the ancient past.

MODERN HISTORY

The investigation of Modern History examines a range of people, ideas, movements, events and developments that have shaped the modern world.
