

BUSINESS STUDIES



ECONOMICS

LEGAL STUDIES

The Legal Studies course develops students' knowledge and understanding of the nature and functions of law and law-making, the development of Australian and international legal systems, the Australian Constitution and law reform.

COMMERCE

Commerce is an elective course offered in year 9 and 10 that teaches students the skills, knowledge and understanding to make effective and informed decisions in a variety of contexts including; commercial, financial, legal and employment.
